PRAYERS FOR OUR B.E. FAMILY




As some of you know, we lost another wonderful man in February. Dave Baxter is sleeping now, waiting with so many others for that Great Day. It was sudden and really

THE SABBATH By Ted Schultz

"The apostles kept Sunday...as a holy day"

An old book of instruction for the Catholic faithful written by Leonard Goffine in 1690 has received more "approbations" than most books that have been published by Catholic writers. Cardinal Gibbons wrote the Preface to a new edition of that book in 1896. In addition, fifteen archbishops and forty-six bishops gave their approbation to this work. Under the heading of **Sunday** we find this instruction:

"Why do we Christians keep Sunday as a holy-day instead of Saturday, which was the day observed under the Old Law?

"The apostles kept Sunday, the first day of the week, as a holy-day for these reasons:" (Then follows four reasons given as to why they kept Sunday as a supposedly holy day).

But no Scripture was given as evidence that the apostles kept Sunday. This is for a good reason. There are no texts to support Sunday sacredness. There are only eight verses that mention "the first day of the week." Here they are in the order they occur in the New Testament:

1) Matthew 28:1. "In the end of the sabbath, as it began to dawn toward the first *day* of the week, came Mary Magdalene and the other Mary to see the sepulcher."

2) Mark 16:1, 2. "And when the sabbath was past, Mary Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James, and Salome, had bought sweet spices,

that they might come and anoint him. And very early in the morning the first *day* of the week, they came unto the sepulcher at the rising of the sun."

3) Mark 16:9. "Now when Jesus was risen early the first *day* of the week, he appeared first to Mary Magdalene, out of whom he had cast seven devils."

4) Luke 24:1. "Now upon the first *day* of the week, very early in the morning, they came unto the sepulcher, bringing the spices which they had prepared, and certain others with them."

5) John 20:1. "The first day of the week cometh Mary Magdalene early, when it was yet dark, unto the sepulcher, and seeth the stone taken away from the sepulcher."

6) John 20:19. "Then the same day at evening, being the first day of the week, when the doors were shut where the disciples were assembled for fear of the Jews, came Jesus and stood in the midst, and saith unto them, Peace be unto you."

7) Acts 20:7. "And upon the first day of the week, when the disciples came together to break bread, Paul preached unto them, ready to depart on the morrow; and continued his speech until midnight."

8) 1 Corinthians 16:2. "Upon the first *day* of the week let every one of you lay by him in store, as *God* hath prospered him, that there be no gatherings when I come."

None of these "first day" texts say anything about the apostles keeping the first day of the week as a holy day. No mention is made about a church service. Nor is there any mention about Jesus or the apostles changing the sanctity of the seventh day Sabbath to the first day of the week – for any reason. None of these first day texts call the first day the Lord's day. The above first five texts show us that the women went to the tomb on the first day of the week **after** they "rested the sabbath day according to the commandment." Luke 23:56.

Luke, a Gentile, wrote this about thirty years after the resurrection. Luke's account shows that the women who loved Jesus kept the Sabbath **after** the death of Christ. Luke, who also wrote the book of Acts, mentions "the first day of the week" only once in the book of Acts, but mentions the Sabbath nine times.

Catholic Press

"Sunday is a Catholic institution, and its claims to observance can be defended only on Catholic principles...From the beginning to the end of Scripture there is not a single passage which warrants the transfer of weekly public worship from the last day of the week to the first." *Catholic Press* (Sydney), August 25, 1900.

Catholic Christian Instructed

"Question. – Has the [Catholic] church power to make any alterations in the commandments?

"Answer. – ...Instead of the seventh day, and other festivals appointed by the old law, the church has prescribed the Sundays and holy days to be set apart for God's worship; and these we are obliged to keep in consequence of God's commandment, instead of the ancient Sabbath." – Rt. Rev. Dr. Challoner, *Catholic Christian Instructed*, p. 211.

Proof of the church's power to command holy days

"Question, – By whom was it [the Sabbath] changed?

"Answer, – By the governors of the church, the apostles, who also kept it; for St. John was in the Spirit on the Lord's day which was Sunday. Apoc. 1:10.

"Ques. – How prove you that the church hath power to command feasts and holy days?

"Ans. – By the very act of changing the Sabbath into Sunday, which Protestants allow of; and therefore they fondly contradict themselves, by keeping Sunday strictly, and breaking most other feasts commanded by the same church.

"Ques. – How prove you that?

"Ans. – Because by keeping Sunday, they acknowledge the church's power to ordain feasts, and to command them under sin; and by not keeping the rest [of the feasts] by her commanded, they again

deny, in fact, the same power." Rev. Henry Tuberville, D.D.R.C., *An Abridgment of the Christian Doctrine*, p. 58. (1833).

The answer to the first question above is not biblical as we have already shown. There is no verse in the Bible that refers to the first day of the week being the Lord's day.

Pope has power to change times, to abrogate laws

"The Pope has power to change times, to abrogate laws, and to dispense with all things, even the precepts of Christ." *Ferraris' Ecclesiastical Dictionary*, Decretal de Tranlatic Epriscop. Cap.

The prophecies of Scripture foretold of a power that would "think to change times and laws." Daniel 7:25. This claim of the pope's power is a direct fulfillment of prophecy.

Pope can modify divine law

"The Pope can modify divine law, since his power is not of man, but of God, and he acts as vicegerent of God upon earth." Lucius Ferraris, *Prompta Ribliothica*, "Papa," art. 2, translated.

But where in Scripture does God give to any man the command to change His law? God has given a warning not to tamper with his law. "Ye shall not add unto the word which I command you, neither shall ye diminish aught from it, that ye may keep the commandments of the LORD your God which I command you." Deuteronomy 4:2. "What thing soever I command you, observe to do it: thou shalt not add thereto, nor diminish from it." Deuteronomy 12:32.

The prophecies that speak of a power that thinks to change God's law is also spoken of as receiving "his power, and his seat, and great authority" (Rev. 13:2) from the dragon – not God. Revelation 12:9 tells us who the dragon is.

Church transferred the solemnity from Saturday to Sunday

"Question.–Which is the Sabbath day? "Answer.–Saturday is the Sabbath day. "Ques.–Why do we observe Sunday instead of Saturday?

"Ans.-We observe Sunday instead of Saturday because the Catholic Church, in the Council of Laodicea (A. D. 336), transferred the solemnity from Saturday to Sunday." Rev. Peter Geiermann, C.S.S.R., *The Convert's Catechism of Catholic Doctrine*, p. 50, 2nd. Edition, 1910. This catechism received the blessing of Pope Pius X.

Nowhere in the Bible

"Nowhere in the Bible is it stated that worship should be changed from Saturday to Sunday." Martin J. Scott, *Things Catholics Are Asked About*, (1927 ed.), p. 136.

This statement in its brevity states the matter as it actually is. Indeed, there is not a text of Scripture in either the Old or New Testaments where Sunday is sanctified. This, Cardinal Gibbons now assures us.

"Is not every Christian obliged to sanctify Sunday and to abstain on that day from unnecessary servile work? Is not the observance of this law among the most prominent of our sacred duties? <u>But you may</u> <u>read the Bible from Genesis to Revelation, and you</u> <u>will not find a single line authorizing the</u> <u>sanctification of Sunday</u>. The Scriptures enforce the religious observance of Saturday, a day which we never sanctify." James Cardinal Gibbons, *The Faith of Our Fathers*, (1917 ed.), pp. 72, 73. Emphasis supplied.

If the Bible is consulted

"If we consulted the Bible only, we should still have to keep holy the Sabbath Day, that is Saturday." John Laux, *Course in Religion for the Catholic High Schools and Academies*, Vol. 1, (1936 ed.), p. 51.

Catechism of the Council of Trent

The decisive Counter Reformation Council of Trent which was held from 1545 to 1563 resulted in the *Cathechismus Romanus*. Three years after the Council Pope Pius V ordered the Vatican Press to publish the catechism for all the priests. This catechism says, "It pleased the church of God, that the religious celebration of the Sabbath day should be transferred 'to the Lord's day [Sunday]'" *Catechism* of the Council of Trent (Donovan's translation, 1867), Part 3, chap. 4, p. 345. FAMILY WORSHIP IN MY LIFE *My Life Today, Ellen G. White*

Humble yourselves in the sight of the Lord, and he shall lift you up. James 4:10.

If ever there was a time when every house should be a house of prayer, it is now. Infidelity and skepticism prevail. Iniquity abounds. Corruption flows in the vital currents of the soul, and rebellion against God breaks out in the life. Enslaved by sin, the moral powers are under the tyranny of Satan. The soul is made the sport of his temptation; and unless some mighty arm is stretched out to rescue him, man goes where the arch rebel leads the way.

And yet in this time of fearful peril some who profess to be Christians have no family prayer....

The idea that prayer is not essential is one of Satan's most successful devices to ruin souls. Prayer is communion with God, the fountain of wisdom, the source of strength and peace and happiness. Jesus prayed to the Father "with strong crying and tears." ... "Pray one for another," James says; "the effectual fervent prayer of a righteous man availeth much."

By sincere, earnest prayer parents should make a hedge about their children. They should pray with full faith that God will abide with them, and that holy angels will guard them and their children from Satan's cruel power.... How appropriate it is for parents to gather their children about them before the fast is broken and point them to the heavenly Father, who so liberally gives them the bounties of His providence! How fitting for them to thank Him for His protection during the night and to ask for His help and grace and the watchcare of His angels during the day! How fitting, also, when evening comes, to gather once more before Him and praise Him for the mercies and blessings of the day that is past!

GETHSEMANE Desire of Ages, Ellen G. White

In company with His disciples, the Saviour slowly made His way to the garden of Gethsemane. The Passover moon, broad and full, shone from a cloudless sky. The city of pilgrims' tents was hushed into silence.



Jesus had been earnestly conversing with His disciples and instructing them; but as He neared Gethsemane, He became strangely silent. He had often

visited this spot for meditation and prayer; but never with a heart so full of sorrow as upon this night of His last agony. Throughout His life on earth He had walked in the light of God's presence. When in conflict with men who were inspired by the very spirit of Satan, He could say, "He that sent Me is with Me: the Father hath not left Me alone; for I do always those things that please Him." John 8:29. But now He seemed to be shut out from the light of God's sustaining presence. Now He was numbered with the transgressors. The guilt of fallen humanity He must bear. Upon Him who knew no sin must be laid the iniquity of us all. So dreadful does sin appear to Him, so great is the weight of guilt which He must bear, that He is tempted to fear it will shut Him out forever from His Father's love. Feeling how terrible is the wrath of God against transgression, He exclaims, "My soul is exceeding sorrowful, even unto death."

As they approached the garden, the disciples had marked the change that came over their Master. Never before had they seen Him so utterly sad and silent. As He proceeded, this strange sadness deepened; yet they dared not question Him as to the cause. His form swayed as if He were about to fall. Upon reaching the garden, the disciples looked anxiously for His usual place of retirement, that their Master might rest. Every step that He now took was with labored effort. He groaned aloud, as if suffering under the pressure of a terrible burden. Twice His companions supported Him, or He would have fallen to the earth.

Near the entrance to the garden, Jesus left all but three of the disciples, bidding them pray for themselves and for Him. With Peter, James, and John, He entered its secluded recesses. These three disciples were Christ's closest companions. They had beheld His glory on the mount of transfiguration; they had seen Moses and Elijah talking with Him; they had heard the voice from heaven; now in His great struggle, Christ desired their presence near Him. Often they had passed the night with Him in this retreat. On these occasions, after a season of watching and prayer, they would sleep undisturbed at a little distance from their Master, until He awoke them in the morning to go forth anew to labor. But now He desired them to spend the night with Him in prayer. Yet He could not bear that even they should witness the agony He was to endure.

"Tarry ye here," He said, "and watch with Me."

He went a little distance from them—not so far but that they could both see and hear Him—and fell prostrate upon the ground. He felt that by sin He was being separated from His Father. The gulf was so broad, so black, so deep, that His spirit shuddered before it. This agony He must not exert His divine power to escape. As man He must suffer the consequences of man's sin. As man He must endure the wrath of God against transgression...

...Behold Him contemplating the price to be paid for the human soul. In His agony He clings to the cold ground, as if to prevent Himself from being drawn farther from God. The chilling dew of night falls upon His prostrate form, but He heeds it not. From His pale lips comes the bitter cry, "O My Father, if it be possible, let this cup pass from Me." Yet even now He adds, "Nevertheless not as I will, but as Thou wilt." (Desire of Ages, Ch. 74) The above words hurt my heart so deep. Can you imagine going through that? He loved us so much, and none of us deserve anything He gave. However, He freely gave it anyway. Let's love Him and give Him our hearts completely. Pray for forgiveness. He and His Father deserve our all.

MORE YUMMY VEGAN RECIPES!



SIMPLE SPANISH STEW Veganuary-Sally Thompson

This flavor-packed but simple Spanish stew is easy to create and even easier to eat! Read our instructions on how to create this classic, plant-based vegan stew. Prep Time: 5 minutes Cooking Time: 90 minutes Serves: 2

INGREDIENTS: (DOUBLE IF YOU LIKE)

2 servings of Pearl Barley
1 Vegetable Stock Cube
1 Tin of Plum Tomatoes
1 Handful Whole Black Pitted Olives
1 White Onion, diced largely
1 Sweet Red Pepper, diced largely
1/2 Butternut Squash, diced largely
1/2 Butternut Squash, diced largely
1 Tin of Chickpeas
2 tsp Smoked Paprika
1 Tbsp Nutritional Yeast
Sea Salt & Black Pepper to taste
Lemon Juice
Fresh Flat leaf Parsley

INSTRUCTIONS

Boil the pearl barley in a separate pan for approximately 30-40 minutes.

In a large stew pan, fry off the onion until lightly browned, adding in each of the seasonings.

Add the butternut squash and a touch of water to help it soften. Steam for around 10 minutes.

Add the remaining vegetables and steam for a further 5 minutes.

Add the vegetable stock and tinned tomatoes, bringing the whole mix to the boil.

Simmer for another 30 minutes, adding the chickpeas and kale after around 20 minutes.

Stir in the pearl barley and stir thoroughly.

Serve with a sprig of parsley on the top! Season to taste.

Eat with yummy homemade bread, crackers, pita bread or anything you like! Add some vegan sour cream on top! Enjoy!

HEALTHY SAUTEED APPLES Beauty Bites.org

These healthy sauteed apples are quick and easy to make with cinnamon, vanilla and without any added sugar. If you're wondering what to do with the apples lounging in your kitchen, don't hesitate and make this delicious low-calorie dessert with apples in 5-8 minutes.



Prep Time: 3 minutes Cook Time: 5 minutes Total Time: 5 minutes

INGREDIENTS

4 apples, peeled, cored and chopped
2 tsp coconut oil
1 tbsp water
2 tsp cinnamon
1 tsp vanilla
a pinch of nutmeg
a pinch of salt
optional: 1 tsp maple syrup

INSTRUCTIONS

Peel, core and chop the apples into bite-sized pieces.

Add them to a nonstick pan with coconut oil, cinnamon, nutmeg, vanilla and a little splash of water and stir together to coat. Cover and cook at medium-high heat for one minute.

Then take the lid off, reduce heat and keep stirring occasionally for another 3-4 minutes or until some of the apples become golden brown.

Take out and serve immediately. You can add nuts to it, too! Anything you like! Or use it for ice cream topping (vegan or not!)
